PY 799 Co-Occurring Mental Health Substance Use Conditions: System and Treatment Issues

This course provides the organizational and clinical practice foundations for advanced practice with individuals experiencing mental health and substance use conditions. It reviews relevant models, organizational structures and practice implications for providing effective co-occurring services. The course is designed to heighten student's awareness of the impact of co-occurring disorders have on individual's lives and on the systems and approaches designed to provide needed services. 3 cr.

PY 810 Human Sexuality

An analysis of the anatomical, psychological, and cultural aspects of a wide range of topics in the area of human sexuality is undertaken. Emphasis is on the development of an understanding and appreciation of the role of sexuality throughout the various stages of life. 3 cr.

ED 710 Counseling Children and Adolescents

Students will explore the implications of child development for counseling interventions. Participants will review counseling theory and explore developmentally appropriate counseling techniques. The course will also address the physical, emotional and social development of children and adolescents and examine the relationship between development and counseling needs. Emphasis will be given to working with parents and other family members. 3 cr.

PY 799 Creative Therapy Techniques

This course will explore the use of artistic expression and creativity as a means of enhancing insight and promoting change. It will include a review of Narrative Therapy, Art Therapy and Music Therapy theories and techniques. It is meant to provide the basis of a new counselor "tool box" with ideas for activities and interventions for youth, couples, families and groups. 3 cr.

PY 799 College Student Development Issues

This course will provide an overview of student development theory, current psychosocial issues with the college student population, and a holistic approach to providing services to support academic and personal growth and success. 3 credits

PY 801 Marriage/Family Counseling

A consideration of the dynamics of marriage and family relationships is given. The emphasis is on understanding the structure and function of marriage, the various aspects of the marital relationship, family systems, and ways the counselor may approach marriage and family counseling as a creative, preventative, and healing interaction. 3 cr.

PY 846 Diagnosis and Treatment/Adults

This course provides a general framework for understanding psychopathology in the adult population and the process of diagnosing and designing treatment plans for mental disorders in adults. 3 cr.
